Before Reading:

Look at the pages with your child. Let your child turn the pages. On some of the pages, you name something that you see and have your child repeat what you said. You can also talk about what you think is happening, such as "... baby llama looks upset".

During Reading:

Read each page of the book. Use a different tone or volume of voice for the words in bold type. This will emphasize the rhyming of the story. Each time you reread it encourage your child to repeat any or all of the rhyme that they remember. Example, ... Llama llama ... red pajama... listens, quiet, ... for his _____ (let your child finish it with mama).

After Reading:

Ask your child to find their favorite page in the book. Write the rhyme from that page on a piece of paper in big letters. Post it on the refrigerator or somewhere in the house. When getting a drink or food, repeat the rhyme with your child.

Related Reading:

Go to the public library and find some more rhyming books. Ask the librarian to help you. Read another bedtime tale in *Kiss Good Night* by Amy Hest.
